Dear Supporters and Friends,

A SEASON FOR PROJECTS. After an extremely busy spring (which included a trip to the Philippines to take part in our 1st Haven of Grace Seminary graduation), I was able to get back, get some rest, and then launch into some projects. The main project for the summer has been preparing my course notes for Church History (the class I will be teaching this fall). Counting the time reading, researching, compiling and editing notes, etc., this project will take me anywhere between 400 to 600 hours. This is such an expansive (albeit vital) study. Church history offers so many lessons, warnings and encouragements. Sadly, many pastors are deficient in their understanding of the past 2,000 years of the Christian church which puts them in a vulnerable position when it comes to formulating sound doctrine, counteracting heresies, being knowledgeable about various cults and religions, and simply making wise choices as a leader. There are countless pitfalls a pastor can avoid just by becoming familiar with church history.

INDIA/NEPAL WORKSHOPS. Pacific Rim Missions International has been hosting workshops for pastors at the India/Nepal border for the past few years. It has been about a year since I had the chance to teach these men. This past week we jumped back into our study on Pneumatology (Study of the Holy Spirit)—with an particular emphasis on the gift of tongues. It was a great first session, and I am looking forward to continuing to dig into 1 Corinthians 14 with these students. They had some great questions to start with, and it is a joy to see their hunger to learn more about God's Word.

FAMILY UPDATES. The summer is a good time to give an update on our family. **Sarah** is enjoying the break from homeschooling. She has her plan in place for the fall, and has ordered all of the materials for the upcoming year. She does a great job organizing the schooling for the kids.
